Outcomes Review
<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. SHP participated in a wider variety of competitive activities arranged by SCA, sparking further interest in sports from the children. Increased number of children taking part in competitive sport after school (however this is only in KS2). KS1 club numbers fluctuated between 3-9 children throughout the year. KS2 club numbers ranged from 6-14. 2. Children from Y3-6 had more opportunity to attend structured competition, usually during the school day or after school. 3. One member of ASC staff attended the CPD sessions offered by SCA. Feedback was positive and CPD has been fed into Breakfast Club activities. The member of staff will support After School Club staff in September with PE activities for children. 4. The children are asked each half term about their Sports Club provision and changes made accordingly. The children are keen to be involved and SHP have now utilised the sports after school club sessions to train for competitions. 5. Staff involved with sport are now more confident with sport delivery. Some NQTs and RQTs are also involved with some sports activities and support the children with competitions. 6. PE leader organised events well. Some additional release time needed to ensure all letters, staffing and risk assessments were completed. 7. Swimming – no passes were handed out this year as all Y6 left being able to swim.
